

The Wisdom of God

I have been reading about the Wisdom of God, and because God is all Wise we should trust Him fully without doubt. But the question is; Do we? The answer is “NO”, and the reason is because we think our wisdom is above His. Oh how foolish is man's thoughts!

It comes down to this: there are three classes of people.

The average congregation is divided into three classes of people: the unblessed, the uncommitted and the committed. Which class do you fall into?

The Unblessed

The unblessed are those who do not believe sufficiently in the wisdom of God to trust Him to take their life over. They have never given themselves to Jesus Christ, because they know it means a commitment that they are not willing to make. They may believe in God; they may believe that Christ died for their sins, but they are not ready to surrender themselves and let God run their world. They are out of the fold, not born again, unblessed.

The Uncommitted

Then theres the uncommitted. They are not rebels against God; they have “accepted Christ,” as we say, and had some kind of spiritual experience, but they've never been willing to turn their lives over. They have not been willing to say before God, “Lord, You run my life from now on.” They are hanging in the middle. They are the ones that are always spiritually up and down. They have not truly made Christ Lord of their lives.

The uncommitted will say, “I'm saved and that's it. I believe I'm saved and I'm kept.” They've got all the answers, but they're uncommitted and miserable.

The Committed

Then there are the committed ones—they've committed themselves to the wisdom of God forever. They are satisfied that God shall have His way and that His wisdom will rule them from now on. They won't interfere and let their own heads get in the way. They begin to shine like the sun. You can always recognize them. You can recognize them because they are the committed ones, the ones who have gone to God and have said, in effect, “My Father, from this moment on take over my life. You run it; I will not interfere. I will not complain if it's hard, get discouraged if it seems to fail or take credit if it seems to succeed. Thine be the glory, Thine be the honor. I'm committed, Lord to Thy eternal wisdom. I'm not going to dishonor Thee by doubting.”

You can make that decision. It's just like getting married. Two people simply say “I do” and they are married. No matter which direction their emotions may run, they've settled something by a vow. In the same way, you can go before God and pull that ragged uncommitted life into full commitment. God say, A”Wilt thou, from this day forward, forsake all others and take Me? Will you trust My Son to run your life and not try to run it yourself? If so, answer 'I Do.' “

If you answer, “Oh, God, I do.” it becomes to you what the vows of wedlock become. It changes the course and direction and relationships of your life.

Will you dare to trust His eternal wisdom? If so, then pray, *Oh, God the Father, forgive me for doubting. Thou art infinitely wise and I need infinite wisdom in my ignorance. Take over my life and be my wisdom, my righteousness, my sanctification. From here on, I acknowledge that Thou are eternally wise. Be my Anchor and Guiding Star.*
